Who is EUROFEU?



Additionally, EUROFEU is an accredited observer to European key organizations allowing us to elevate our member's subjects to a European level.



Fixed Firefighting Systems

This section focuses on extinguishing systems others than sprinkler systems. These are CO₂, inert gas and halocarbon extinguishing systems, Plus watermist extinguishing systems as well as active fire prevention systems using Oxygen reduction. The consequences of the EU regulations and directives, in particular the Construction Products Regulation, the Pressure Equipment Directive from the European Commission (EC), leading to the CE marking, are reviewed and discussed within this section.

Information on other regulations, such as the European Agreement dealing with the international transport of dangerous goods by road and rail, are also an important topic of our work.



Portable Fire Extinguishers

Manufacturers of portable and mobile fire extinguishers are represented in this section. It supports the development of European directives.

Particular topics include the European Standard for Fire Extinguishers (EN 3 series); the Pressure Equipment Directive (Directive 2014/68/ EU); the Marine Equipment Directive (Directive 2014/90/UE, and its periodically revised Implementing Regulation); the Convention for the Transport of Dangerous Goods (European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road/ADR); Guideline to the CLP Regulation (Guidelines on the Application of the Regulation on the Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Substances and Mixtures).



Fire Fighting Agents

The Firefighting Agents Section was established as the European representation of the fire protection industry dealing with all aspects of research and development, manufacturing, testing and application and regulatory aspects of extinguishing agents such as firefighting foams, wetting agents, dry chemical powders, extinguishing gases, etc. (water excluded).

It is the aim of the EUROFEU FFA to strengthen transnational cooperation between National Trade Associations and companies in the fire protection industry across Europe and to coordinate communication and knowledge exchange, thus driving the improvement of performance and efficiency of extinguishing agents and their toxicological and eco-toxicological footprint.

EUROFEU strives to be acknowledged as the experts in the field of fire protection by the customer base of our members, authorities and legislators by establishing communication and information exchange.
